1. That the objectives of the Trust shall be wholly for the public and charitable purposes and incomes shall be applied for the same and accumulated in India wholly for public & charitable purposes without prejudice to generality of provisions aforesaid and the following shall be deemed to be the principal objectives of **"STAR 'X' MONTENSSORI GOLD 313"**

TRUST DEED:-

The amount contributed by the founder/settler & Trustees shall and will stand possessed the same upon the trust and also the trustees may from time to time receive for augmenting the trust funds as donations, gifts, interests to capital deposit amount of Rs.1000/- (Rupees one thousand only) etc. for the General public and General Purpose of the trust fund of the trust arising from the subscriptions, donations, grants, or otherwise from any sources and also of any investment etc. representing the same, (HEREINAFTER CALLED 'THE TRUSTEE')

Further-more the net income from the said trust fund, to apply both the capital and income of the said trust fund for the purpose and betterment of the aims and objects only of the said trust.

TRUST PROPERTIES:

The Trustees shall stand and possessed of the said amount of corpus and such other properties, both moveable and immoveable as may be acquired from time to time by the Trust, viz. by purchase, exchange, grants subscriptions, or the endowment donations gifts, contribution or in any manner whatsoever all of which shall be designated 'THE TRUST PROPERTIES' of the Trust herein mentioned above.

EXECUTIVE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

That all the trustees of the said trust shall be called 'THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF TRUSTEES' LIFE MEMBER".


The above mentioned trustees of the said trust shall be called 'THE LIFE MEMBER TRUSTEE'.

FOUNDER MEMBERS:

The above said settler/chairman/founder of this Trust and all the said Trustees i.e., shall be called 'THE FOUNDER OF THE SAID TRUST'

THE MANAGING TRUSTEE:

The Founder Trustees – Ms. Harshita Mehra shall be the permanent Managing Trustee of the said trust till his lifetime. After Ms. Harshita Mehra her son/daughter will be the managing trustee however it shall be opened that the Managing Trustees shall be elected by 2/3rd majority of the said Board of Trustee of the said Trust, in the General Meeting of the Board.



WHO MAY BE APPOINTED AS TRUSTEE:

Any person may be appointed as Trustee or trustees of the said Trust appointed by the majority of 2/3rd of the present Trustees and with the consent of the Settler/Founder/Chairman.

WHO MAY BE APPOINTED AS Members:

Any person may be appointed as member of the said trust by paying annual fees of Rupees One Thousand with the consent the Settler/Founder/Chairman.

THE MINUTES BOOK:-

It shall be kept by the managing trustee Minutes Book is an office book in which the presence of every trustee and all proceedings of the meeting of the Board of trustees shall be recorded in the minutes book and shall be signed by Chairman of the meeting either at the conclusion thereof or at the next meeting when it they shall be confirmed.

BANK ACCOUNT:-

The Trustees shall have to deposit the trust money or any portion thereof in any nationalized Bank, such account can be operated by the signatures of any one Founder and any one trustee of the said trust.

To open any type of bank account (s) weather saving account, current account, fixed or otherwise, in the name of the Trust or institution (s) or programmed (s) run by the Trust with any scheduled banks (s) or post office (s) and to operate by the authorized signatory.

BOOK OF ACCOUNT:-

Proper and regular account of all accounts, receipts and expenditure of the said trust shall be maintained regularly.

AUDIT:-

On 31st day of March of every year General Account shall be taken of all the assets and liabilities of the trust and an income & expenditure account for the whole year and a balance sheet as on 31st day of March shall be passed by the Trustees The accounts of the trust shall be audited annually by a chartered Accountant appointed by the Trustees for the purpose.

DISSOLUTION OF THE TRUST:-

In the event of dissolution of the TRUST, the entire Trust funds shall be realized and first be used for payment of liabilities of the Trust. The assets left if any, shall be disbursed, after obtaining prior approval of the Commissioner of Income Tax (Exemption) New Delhi, to other Trusts having similar objectives and who have been granted registration u/s 12 AA of the Income Tax Act 1961. In no circumstances it shall be distributed in any manner, to any member of the Board of Trustees or their relatives or related concerns.



Main Objectives of Trust:

- To open and run play school and primary school.
- To open and run higher secondary school in future.
- To open and run, Educational vocational schools or institutions to bring education within the reach of poor & backward children at National Level.
- To provide libraries, publish books on technical & computer educational, cultural & social subjects, organize discussions & Seminars to impart knowledge & understanding amongst the people.
- To provide hostels & residential accommodation that may be considered necessary for the students for each member of the staff that may be eligible for it.
- To establish & maintain institutions for the handicapped & for adult education, like vocational training in vocations of house hold industry, semi – skilled jobs for self employment, computer, technical , mechanical, civil, Fashion designing, Beautician, Safety courses, Welding, Social science, languages, fine arts, crafts, music, painting, modeling , Pre Recruitment Trainings for Youth, Yoga, competition entrance coaching etc.
- To provide the best education available in some of the best schools in India Emphasis would be on character building, self discipline & the development of the creative & social faculties. The Society aims at producing well informed & well assured young children just the kind of children that our country needs.
- To provide the 3,6 month, 1 & 2 Year all kind of technical and non technical courses /programmes prepare syllabus and execute the examinations and issue certificates throughout India and give franchises throughout India
- To strive to meet changing need of providing comprehensive Technical & computer education to develop varies facets of personality and to impart education to children on the most modern lines & provide an environment congenial to growth & development of the children.
- To arrange & organize the social, cultural & computer educational programmes from time to time.
- To provide free meals, clothes, medicines and other needy things to the poor and needy children of widows.
- To establish, manage, maintain and run Educational, vocational and Technical Institution s anywhere in India, in urban, rural and backward areas and or to provide financial assistance and other facilities to such institutions.
- To promote technical education Courses, computer Courses, fashion designing Courses, Safety courses, Welding Courses, dance, theatres, music, arts, songs, yoga, meditation, creativity of the dancers, artists, musicians, singers, poets, theatre persons and other related to any form of visual and performing arts, Pre Recruitment Trainings for Youth , in particular young professional through performance, seminars, talks and workshops, Competitive Exams coachings, All types of New generation courses and to achieve high degree of proficiency in various types of India Classical Dance forms.

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- To establish, manage maintain and run homes Institutions for the welfare relieve the poor handicapped, old, orphans, widows etc. for their education training to household and cottage industries.
- To promotes harmonies understanding and equal respect for all religions, cultures, races and ideologies and for that purposes to arrange cultural exchange programs, seminars, tours etc. establish, manage maintain and run spiritual co-operative communities and institutes of inter cultural understanding.
- To promote research in the study of Indian system of medicine, homeopathy, and nature cure etc. and ancient Indian culture.
- To give or establish prizes for excellence in the field of (a) Social services (b) human understanding (c) scientific, technical etc. work / research for peace in the country.
- To grant scholarships or provide financial aid to poor / meritorious students in the field of education.
- To complete, publish and distribute or give, financial aid, in the publication of any literature for the promotion of the above objects.
- To open branches where ever considered expedient for the promotion of above objects.
- To Promote and create opportunities for India technical education Courses, computer Courses, fashion designing Courses, Safety courses, Welding Courses Classical dance & Music traditions, Pre Recruitment Trainings for Youth at the performing level.
- To use the audio – visual media for furtherance of its aims and objects.
- To take up the matter with the competent authorities for common interest of the residents for providing and or improving upon common Park, drainage, roads, Street – lights, scavenging, water and electricity supplies, banking, post office facilities in the area like Park, drainage, roads, street – light, scavenging, water and electricity supplies, banking, post office, bus service facilities, community hall and Barat-Ghar, milk booth, health centre, rationing shop, mini – super bazaar, shopping facilities.
- To promote and revive the traditional arts and crafts of India.
- To provide assistance and opportunities to children and young people desirous and eager to learn traditional arts and crafts and folk dances as a profession from best masters and professional in this field and thereby, create in them the concepts that may lead to greater growth in the field of art.
- To promote interest in general public in Indian art culture, music and thus spread this culture far and wide.
- To compile, arrange and make ballets on social issues etc. and show them and help in raising moral character and social awareness of people.
- To mutual exchange of artists, collaborations with other organization etc.
- To maintain run and construct Basti Vikas Kendra, Jan Suvidha Parlsar, Roads, Foot Path, Anganvadi, Libraries etc. with the help of concerned Government authorities for giving the education to the students, socially neglected people and children.

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- To develop a good teaching faculty and invite experts in the field of Technical education & Indian classical dances especially kathak and promote research, documentation and dissemination on the various aspects of the dance form.
- To translate, print, publish, circulate and distribute appropriate material for distribution of useful knowledge through magazine, pamphlets or other printing mode for the development and promotion, benefit and advancement of music, dance etc.

- To purchase, lease, secure by exchange or license, hire or otherwise acquire any moveable or immovable property and any interest, easement, right and privilege necessary or alter any moveable and immovable property of the Society and undertake such other activities as may be necessary and incidental to the objects of the Trust.
- To frame bye-laws and rules and regulations for the conduct of the business of the Trust and its officers and employees.
- To make adequate arrangements for poor, widows and handicapped orphans, old aged and mentally retired persons.
- To do all such other lawful, acts, deeds and things as are incidental Or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

Other Objectives of Trust:

- **Agriculture**
 - a. Development of agricultural land in hilly area through provision of assistance for bounding, leveling and shaping of land, fencing and reclamation, as well as dissemination of farming technology.
 - b. Reclamation of land, soil conservation and afforestation.
 - c. To establish Krishi Vigyan Kendra.
 - d. To enhance seed development activities to prepare new hybrids of different varieties.
 - e. To facilitate awareness regarding importance of organic farming.

- **Disaster management**
 - a. In the event of natural calamities such as draught, floods and cyclones:
 - i. To undertake voluntary work for victims of calamities through contribution, shramdan, govt. help Etc.
 - ii. To arrange financial assistance from central/state govt. and voluntary organization.
 - iii. To organize and maintain a youth task force for rendering on the spot service during disasters and natural calamities.
 - iv. To maintain and orient the people of flood and drought prone areas in advance to own preventive measures.

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- **Education & Employment**

- a. To establish and provide educational centers/schools/institutions for non-formal education, school education, higher education, vocational education/training, computer education, education in engineering, education in business management, education in medical sciences, nursing college etc.
- b. To facilitate self employment by delivering technical and financial services to the women and unemployed youth of the rural and urban areas through cooperation from state/central govt. / govt. bodies.

- e. To promote art & culture, maintain, encourage, and assist/help setting up Centers for promotion of Human Rights.
- f. To promote social progress and better standards of life and activity in cooperation with the Government of India and other countries to promote human rights education.
- g. To develop a more distinctive and effective role for the International Court of Justice to fulfill the Human Rights and spread the messages/values of Human Rights by way of Human Rights education.
- h. To open training camps and workshops for the development of arts, plays and culture and raise funds through subscriptions, donations, trade to fulfill the aims and objects.
- i. To establish and conduct centers of treatment and rehabilitation for the victims of violators of Human Rights.
- j. To actively join hands with the Government of India and other countries to promote Human Rights education and help legal, social and economic discrimination against women and their exploitation in different ways.
- k. To publish books, encyclopedias, monographs, journals and directories on Human Rights and study and prepare reports on the violation, etc.
- f. To effectively work for gender inequalities, exploitations and injustice as also to encourage / assist talented artists, poets, singers, writers, social workers, journalists, doctors, judges, etc.
- g. To organize and participate in cultural programmes to foster a spirit of nationalism to achieve co-operation in solving various problems of economic, social, cultural or humanitarian character and in promoting and encouraging respect for human rights
- **Information technology**
 - a. To setup information centers at block/district/state level to help the people about latest developments. If possible these types of centre can be setup at village level also.
- **Legal literacy**
 - a. To make rural people conscious of their rights and responsibilities, enabling them to stiff for honest efficient administration, speedier justice and for better education, health and other services.
 - b. To provide women in destitute legal aid and adequate counseling.
- **Livestock management**
 - a. To establish research center for high milk yielding varieties of buffaloes cows etc.
 - b. To setup a semen bank for artificial insemination of animals.
 - c. To establish hospital and mobile Medicare facilities for livestock.
- **Marketing facilities**

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- a. To setup OWN MARKET with the help of center and state govt.
- b. To establish retail outlets for the farmers in rural/urban areas with a minimum of 20-25 outlets at different localities in Delhi for direct sale to consumers.

- **Processing**
 - a. To work for processing of plants, herbs, shrubs etc. for medicines.
 - b. To implement schemes of food processing sector.
 - c. To setup food processing units, food parks etc.
 - d. To carryout manufacturing marketing of low cost building material.
 - e. To understand research & development projects.
 - f. To setup demonstration units & pilot projects.
 - g. To setup food & agro processing units.
- **Publications**
 - a. To setup press & print literature, magazines & newspaper for social welfare.
 - b. To prepare brief curriculum for illiterate people and non-financial education.
- **Research and surveys**
 - a. To conduct various research studies in the field of Agriculture, RCH, Pollution Control, Panchayati Raj, AIDS, Bio-Diversity, Education, Environment, Health, Watershed Management etc.
 - b. To conduct surveys on various topics related to development aspect of community
 - c. To carry out surveys related to the socio-economic aspects of rural and urban life
 - d. To compose herbal garden to enhance methodology of Indian System of Medicine & homeopathy.
- **Seminars/training/camps/workshops**
 - a. To conduct seminars, conferences, lectures at grass root level, District, state and national level on all matters and problems affecting the people.
 - b. To make arrangements for such caliber farmers as are prepared to go abroad to take part in debates and discussion on transfer to latest technology and marketing processes from labs and research centers to land.
 - c. To establish training centers for the farmers to impart knowledge about the latest technology to be adopted by them.
 - d. To organize seminars/camps/workshop/transportations and rallies on the various activities for betterment of the rural & urban poor irrespective of casts and creed.
 - e. To organize voluntary blood donation camps.
 - f. To impart training in horticulture, sericulture, pisciculture, floriculture, poultry, piggyery, goatry, mushroom production, computer application production, stenography, knitting

& tailoring, beautification trade, readymade garments, leather goods, handlooms, khadi & jute diversification textile, handicraft & traditional occupation to the poor & needy people and take above mentioned programmes for providing themselves a sustainable employment.

- g. To setup coaching centers for SC/ST/OBC and others.
- h. To conduct various refresher courses and orientation training programmers.
- i. To impart training in co-operative marketing, processing and storage.
- j. To conduct training for panchayat raj institutions with help of govt.
- k. To periodically organize seminars, workshops or camps to enlighten people on the aspects of aging and the problems of the aged: how best to tackle these.

• **Sport**

- a. To establish stadlums (indoor & outdoor) in both rural & urban areas to promote sports activities for normal and disabled friendly.
- b. To establish swimming pools to enhance swimming activities as sports.
- c. To organize various sports meets at village, block, district and state level.
- d. Conduct sports training and competition for disabled /children with special need.

• **Wasteland development**

- a. To develop wasteland through plantation.
- b. Regeneration of degraded forest land.
- c. Developing a system for surface water management for water harvesting.
- d. Leveling, terracing and bonding of agriculture land in basin areas.
- e. Demonstration on reclamation of wastelands.
- f. Social forestry/tree plantation, community forestry.
- g. Development of pastureland for fodder and fuel.
- h. To motivate village folk including women to take up wastelands development to raise their own nurseries.
- i. Growing of fuel & timber spices on private lands in drought prone areas.
- j. Nurseries and tree plantation on private and common land.

• **Waste management**

- a. To conduct garbage and solid waste management program in rural and urban areas.
- b. To setup a recycling plant for waste products to lessen the pollution and harm to the people.

• **Women empowerment:**

- a. To facilitate formation of groups of women and farmers in rural /urban areas and thereafter bringing them together on a common platform to address issues through federation, clusters and village development committees.
- b. To facilitate microfinance in the groups.
- c. To facilitate women about their rights and eradication of the differences between girls and boys through trainings and shows.
- d. To organize seminars training shows plays at grass root, block, district and state level about the decreasing sex-ratio in India.

• **Youth activities**

- a. To organize and conduct vocational training courses for youth.
- b. To help youth to acquire knowledge skills' to awaken social consciousness' & responsibility.
- c. To evolve and develop the concept of methodology of community work among youth.
- d. To initiate and organize need-oriented rural/urban development programmes.

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- e. To organize and implement schemes that would help poor people to increase their income.
- f. To plan and execute youth exchange programmes; to organize tour and picnics in and out of the country.
- g. To impart education and training of the basis of youth organization methods and practices.
- h. To organize national integration camps.

- j. To organize debates and declamation contest, speech.


All the incomes, earnings, movable / immovable properties of the trust shall be solely utilized and applied towards the promotion of its aims and object only as set forth in the Memorandum of the trust and no profit, thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividends, bonus, profits or in any other manner whatsoever to the present or past members of the trust or to any person claiming through any one or more of the present or the past members.

No member of the trust shall have any personal claim on any moveable or immovable properties of the trust or make any profits, whatsoever, by virtue of this membership.

3. **AND GENERALLY** to do in all public, charitable purposes for public benefit without any discrimination of Caste, Creed, Color, Gender, Religion, Faith, Race or any Nationality. That in case any of the objects of the Trust are held to be non charitable within the meaning of section 2 (15) of the Indian Trust Act, or any statutory modification (s) thereof, the Trustee (s) shall not carry out such objectives.

4. THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING POWERS:

1. To manage the properties, assets and funds of the Trust, from time to time, such regulations (not being inconsistent with this deed) as they may think fit for and necessary for the purposes of such management and control or in connection with the execution of any of the subject herein contained or powers hereby vested in them and may rescind or alter any such regulation.
2. To accept donations, contributions, grants, subscription in cash or in kind from any person, company, firm, association, organizations, government, non government or semi government agencies, national or foreign funding agencies, family Trust, or corporate bodies for furtherance and achievement of the objectives of the Trust.



3. To appoint a managing Trustee, when necessary.
4. To review the affairs of the Trust and necessary.
5. To appoint officers and members of staff for the Trust and to prescribe their condition of service.
6. To open and to provide for operating banking accounts.
7. To raise loans with or without security or to invite donation and financial help.
8. To receive the honorarium or salary against his/her services or involvement in any of the project or program run by the Trust, which must be decided by the Board of Trustees and approved by the Chairman / Chairperson.
9. To authorize person (s) to sign or execute documents on behalf of the Trust.
10. To grant receipts for aid or donation received.
11. To grant Special Power of Attorney to represent the Trustees in connection with any legal or other proceedings.
12. To acquire land or building on the lease or way of purchase.
13. To compromise, compound or refer to Arbitration all actions, proceedings and disputes relating to Trust property or properties.
14. To sell or give on rent/lease or on hire any immovable or moveable property of the Trust for some certain period (s) on such terms and conditions as the Trustees may think fit and proper from time to time.
15. To open any type of bank account (s) whether saving account, current account, fixed or otherwise, in the name of the Trust or institution (s) or program (s) run by the Trust with any scheduled banks (s) or post office (s) and to operate by the authorized signatory or signatories as Board of Trustees shall think fit and proper to authorize any person or persons, unless and until determined otherwise the such bank account(s) shall be opened and operated jointly with signatures of any two members of Board of Trustees. The financial year for the Trust shall be from 1st April to 31st March and the accounts of Trust or institution (s) or programme (s) run by the Trust shall be audited yearly by the auditors b(s) or chartered accountant or a firm of chartered accountants to be appointed by the Board of Trustees and the fee for auditor(s), if paid, shall be a part of outgoing amounts from the Trust Funds.
16. To give guarantee of the assets and property of the Trust, including the bank guarantee on behalf of the Trust to corporate bodies, persons, firms, institutions, as Trustees may decide

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from time to time. The Trustees shall not be personally liable for such guarantees or the securities.

17. To gift, lease, and transfer the immovable and moveable properties of the Trust.

18. To appoint lawyer, pleaders, advocate to file and defend suit or suits filed for and against the Trust and or in the name of the Trust and also file suits for financial and other disputes or dues with different parties and signed executed such application, petition documents for such proceedings and delegate powers to the officers(s), employee(s), staff(s) and Trustee(s) for such proceedings(s) as required from time to time.

19. To appoint new member or members of Board of Trustees by a resolution and to discharge any of the Trustee, who become bankrupt or acts in any manner prejudicial to the interest or objects of the Trust or is convicted of an offence involving moral turpitude or becomes of unsound mind or is otherwise unfit to continue as Trustee, by resolution passed by simple majority of members present and voting in the meeting of Board of Trustees.

20. To appoint from time to time on such terms and conditions as they may determine a Secretary, Manager, Executive Director, Director(s) and other officer(s) or members(s) of staff for carrying out the activities of the Trust and to remove at any time any such Secretary, Manager, Executive Director, Director(s) and other officer(s) or members(s) of staff.

21. After defraying all necessary expenses incurred in the collection or realization of the income from the Trust will be Twenty percent (20%) of the balance of the income shall be kept in a reserve fund to be utilized when, in the opinion of the Board of Trustees, there is any emergency and the remaining income may be utilized for the purpose of the Trust.

22. The Trustees shall invest the Trust fund in government securities, saving certificates, fixed deposits or in any other form of investment authorized under provisions of INDIAN TRUST ACT - 1882 and INDIAN INCOME TAX ACT, 1961, as they shall deem expedient.

23. It has further been decided that as and when the Trust is enclosed or dissolved all the funds of the Trust shall be transferred to the other recognized Public Charitable Trust having similar objectives.

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
24. All questions relating to the management of the Trust or the exercise of the powers vested in the Trust shall be decided at a meeting or, if necessary and expedient, by circulation. Every such question shall be decided by a majority of the Trustees present and voting in any meeting of Board of Trustees or by the circulation, as the case may be and any action or decision of such majority shall be as valid as if it was done or made by the all Trustees. The Founder / Chairman shall have a casting vote.

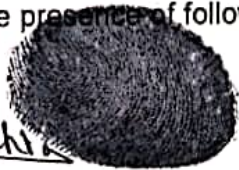


